Service of Celebration and Thanksgiving for the completion of the Rock refurbishment project

11am Sunday 6th October 2024 All Saints Church, Weston, Bath Thank you for coming to this very special service of celebration and dedication as we give thanks to God for this beautifully refurbished church building and for all the hard work and dedication that has gone into the ROCK Project over the past 12 years.

Whether you were present when the ideas were conceived; or you prayed and encouraged along the way; or maybe you have recently come along to All Saints, perhaps as part of the construction team, you are most welcome to this service.

There are a number of examples of first-rate design and craftsmanship in the new building – not all of it seen. One thing in particular to note is the glass sculpture in the Memorial Chapel, which is shown on the front cover of this service booklet. The title of the work is 'Joyful Assembly' and it has been created by Rachael Stone, a longstanding member of All Saints Church and a nationally recognised glass designer.

Our prayer is that this building will see many, many Joyful Assemblies in the years ahead and in so doing it will continue to glorify God and serve the community for many future generations to come.

May we know God's presence and his blessing as we follow Jesus the Good Shepherd together today and in the days that follow.



Before the service begins at 11am, the band led by Phil Day and our organist Chris Carrick will play a selection of music and hymns including *'This earth belongs to God'* a hymn based on Psalm 24 which was sung at the consecration of the new church in 1832 and at the dedication of the enlargement of the church in 1893.

Prayer over the water to be used for blessing and dedication

Reading

Ephesians 2: 12 – 21 Christ Jesus the Chief Cornerstone Revd Tim Watson (Rector of All Saints 1982 – 1994)

Remember that you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you, who once were far away, have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility.

He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.
