There have even been many newsletters, prayer requests, anecdotes, and videos that have not been sent - because they were only written/planned in my head, and now they are lost. I've just picked up the first 1,000 trypraying booklets and the website will soon go live. This is a great resource,



originating in the UK, for nonpraying people to make first steps in faith, and if you haven't already, check it out today: <u>do.trypraying.org</u> Our next step is getting church leaders interested, as well as using them in our local outreach.

I have spent a lot of time - too much - searching online for a suitable vehicle for our first "Prayer van", buying the first bits of equipment for it, and planning the different aspects in my head. I also had the time to spend giving our airbnb its first serious rearrangement and redecoration after 5 years of faithful service to us and our guests.

We kicked off a new smallgroup/homegroup and even though there's only a small handful (who don't come every week) we are glad to have made a start and one of the guys who I met through the coffeeshop, since he doesn't go to church, seems to have a strong faith and would like to help us with some local mission - amazing news.

Lastly I was able to go and visit friends and family in the UK, which I am very grateful for.

Virág's book is still having an impact on people and her colleagues from other centres have mentioned how inspired they are. This weekend we have been invited to share our testimonies at a church run community group for parents with SEND children. (Again, something that came out of the coffeeshop). We hope the message we give will be an encouragement and help everyone step closer to God.
